

SUBJECT: Meeting Minutes 7 and 10 March 2022

The March 7th and 10th meetings of Special Forces Chapter XLV, The Buckeye Chapter, were called to order by SFA 45 Chapter President Mark Arnold, Vice President Patrick Enlow, and Assistant Vice President Jim Butler. Notes from both meetings are in these minutes.

The TREASURER'S REPORT

• **Tom McGrath** reported virtually the Chapter Operational Fund is \$2329.36 and the Ohio Green Beret Support Group account is \$56,836.33; an additional \$75,000 is invested in the Ohio Green Beret Support Group Scholarship Endowment and supervised by The Columbus Foundation's investment management. Tom reported the chapter donated \$3000 payment to the venue to cover some of the cost of B/2/19 SFG's Annual Fete for its Soldiers and significant others.



MEETING DISCUSSION AND ACTION ITEMS (leads for actions noted in bold)

-Meeting agenda was outlined by Mark Arnold and Patrick Enlow. Discussion items follow:

NEW BUSINESS:

1. **Patrick Enlow** discussed the growing threat of <u>cyber security</u>. He said phishing attacks and other malware attacks during 2021 increased by four times the amount of 2020. He encourages chapter members to share documents that include personal or otherwise sensitive information via Google Drive. This requires a Gmail internet account.

2. **Mike Hurdzan** reached out to the church leadership and Terry Dillon's family to inform them the chapter donated \$500 to <u>The Women's Club of Saint John Neumann Catholic Church</u> in recognition for their generous service and food for the CSM(R) Dillon's Celebration of Life.

3. Social Event 2022.

Jim Butler volunteered to organize a social one to two hour get-together that includes family members as a luncheon during a weekend <u>at a location between Columbus and Cincinnati</u>. We may do this at a restaurant, picnic setting, or a hall that would host us. Jim will initially reach out to the restaurant that hosted a similar event during 2016 at the Wilmington, OH Exit on I-71. Jim says this event will be during June or July.

4. **CW4 Chadd Kuhn** provided a fascinating briefing regarding the unclassified elements of the unit's recent deployment to eastern Europe. He also described the SF mutual training with **Ukraine's Territorial Defense units as well as the Ukrainian SOF** and how that translates to their remarkably successful performance in combat against the vastly numerically superior invading Russian forces. <u>Chadd volunteered to provide the same briefing during April's meeting in Cincinnati.</u> And by the way....Berets off to Chadd for his promotion to CW4!

5. SFA National has secured approval from Army ROTC Cadet Command to introduce a new award for Senior (Collegiate) and Junior (High School) ROTC programs. It is the <u>SF</u> <u>Association Award for Excellence</u> for ROTC cadets. The chapter discussed the initiative and voted to decline participation at this time. However, if a chapter member wishes to lead a partnership with a collegiate or high school ROTC program, then the chapter will support it with the purchase of the medal sets. OLD BUSINESS:

 Patrick Enlow stated he will contract the chapter's website to a new web host in December. Patrick has spent dozens of hours recently untangling issues caused by our



current provider.

2. RECRUITING AND MEMBERSHIP.

The chapter officers held an Officers Meeting the week preceding our monthly meeting in Columbus. Membership management was the topic.

The chapter has grown to 171 members. Almost all new members during the past three years signed up as Life members and dozens of guys upgraded to Life status during the past 12 months. We now have only 31 annual members to manage. After a pleasant reminder, 14 of the guys who forgot to renew did renew within seven days of being notified (three of them converted to Life membership), and seven guys remain "unrenewed". This is not bad considering the amount of work the late Bob Deis put into this process each year to get renewals completed.

Andy Schneider volunteered to pick up the good work Bob did as Membership Director for the chapter.

Tom McGrath promised to forward dues and renewals to SFA National the day he receives them and not wait until the end of the renewal year.

Chadd Kuhn drafted instructions on how to renew online. They are at the end of these meeting minutes.

3. <u>ESTATE PLANNING</u>.

At Mike Hurdzan's suggestion, **Mark Arnold** will lead an initiative to craft a document that outlines the method and benefit for members and others to include the Ohio Green Beret Support Group in their estate planning. This is a thoughtful way to make a material donation to this charitable organization. Mark will follow up with an attorney.

4. CHAPTER COINS.

Jim Wetz shared this draft image for a chapter coin. The unit cost of serialized coins is 4 for an order of 100 or more. Jim suggests an order of 100 coins sized at 1-3/4". He expects delivery as early as June if the chapter agrees on the proposed design, see below:





5. SF 4 Life.

Pete Becker continues to coordinate with SFA National regarding his support and provide advice on this initiative. Pete is out of state and preparing to deploy on his next assignment soon.

6. EVENTS.

a. Company B, 2nd Battalion, 19th SF Group Fete. 5 March 2022

Chadd Kuhn provided a briefing regarding this successful event. Chadd was the guest speaker, and his thoughtful topic was "Moving On". **MSG Dan Dixon**, another anchor man at SFA 45 events, was the event's MC. The Grog Bowl ceremony highlighted each



of the unit's multiple deployments. Chadd believes this was the most fun and popular Fete the unit has had. Almost all the unit members are SFA and Chapter 45 Life members. They and their significant others shared their deep appreciation for the chapter donating a total of \$4000 to underwrite much of the event's cost, thus reducing the cost for each unit member.

b. MAJ Darren Baldwin Memorial Tribute. 14 May

Fran Wesseling's son, Darren, passed away on 23 DEC 2021. Chapter members are asked to join Fran, her family, and their friends for this Tribute on 14 May at Worthington Christian Church (north side of Columbus). Details will be shared as Fran and the good people of this Church complete their planning for the event. MAJ Baldwin was with 10th SFG when he suffered two separate IED attacks during his 2005 deployment to Iraq. These resulted in his terribly debilitating TBI. **Chadd Kuhn** will ask the unit leadership to encourage four or more members of B/2/19 SFG attend the event in their OCPs.

c. <u>Dedication Ceremony for Memorial Monument for SFC Dan Crabtree and the</u> <u>fallen of B/2/19 SFG</u> 9 July

Philip Taraska is leading this initiative. The state of Ohio has officially approved the installation of the monument at B/2/19's building location. The dedication ceremony is during a unit drill weekend and all members of SFA 45 are encouraged to attend. Other project members include **Chris Belford** and **Dave Spriggs**.

d. Motorcycle Freedom Ride 13 AUG

Jim Wetz briefed that the ride will follow the same concept as last year's: start at Farrow's north Columbus store, ride to the Buckeye Lake Winery, and terminate at Farrow's Reynoldsburg store. Jim said that Farrow has secured *Billy Gibbons of ZZ Top* as a guest celebrity. Jim also gained the approval from Farrow for the chapter to have the event's Beer Sales concession. The chapter voted favorably for this boost to our fundraising. We will need four volunteers to man the beer truck and another four to support the event's execution. Chapter member, **Joe Metarko** (SFMBC), will help lead this entire project. Jim is also seeking a Ride Captain for the event.

e. <u>3 Gun Shoot 2022</u> 10 SEP

Eric Stansifer continues his planning for a two-day event.

<u>Day One</u>: Our normal 3 Gun Shoot with the additional event of a "Range Day" at the same venue. The competition will be shorter (0900 hrs to 1300 hrs).

The Range Day is an opportunity for sponsors to display and demonstrate their products, probably on the most eastern area of the Club.

Day Two: A GORUCK event at the Club. Eric is coordinating this with chapter member

Steve Ormeroid supports the concept. Its purpose is to provide a venue for and events that attract a larger community of shooters, the public, law enforcement, and the military to interact with each other and also draw more support to our fundraising efforts and recruitment of members to the Gun and Game Club. 4 April at the Hofbräuhaus Newport, KY**14 April** at the AMVETS Post 89, Columbus.


Lunch cost at AMVETS 89 is paid by the chapter, and the Post committed to preparing and serving this for us monthly.


